

ORDINANCE NO. 2020-OR-01
BELLWOOD PUBLIC LIBRARY

**ANNUAL ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO THE ISSUANCE OF
NON-RESIDENT PUBLIC LIBRARY CARDS**

WHEREAS, the Bellwood Public Library is a tax-supported public library operating pursuant to the Illinois Local Library Act, 75 ILCS 5/1-1, *et. seq.*; and

WHEREAS, 75 ILCS 5/4-7(12) of the Illinois Local Library Act provides that the Board of Library Trustees of the Bellwood Public Library shall have the power to extend the privileges and use of the library, including the borrowing of materials on an individual basis by persons residing outside of the jurisdictional boundaries of the Village of Bellwood, Cook County, Illinois, and that if the Board exercises this power, the privilege of library use shall be upon such terms and conditions as the Board of Library Trustees shall from time to time prescribe; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Administrative Code (Title 23, Part 3050, Section 3050.20) requires the Board of Library Trustees of the Bellwood Public Library to annually take action to decide whether to issue non-resident library cards during the ensuing 12 months, and if so, to determine and adopt at that time, the non-resident library card fee formula and fee, if applicable, to be used; and

WHEREAS, 75 ILCS 5/4-7(12) of the Illinois Local Library Act provides that: “A person residing outside of a public library service area must apply for a non-resident library card at the public library located closest to the person's principal residence”; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Library Trustees of the Bellwood Public Library has determined that there are no unserved areas adjacent to the Library taxing area and that given these circumstances, no need exists for the Library to determine a non-resident library card fee method or formula and fee for the ensuing 12 months, *to wit*, **from June 1, 2020 through May 31, 2021**; and

WHEREAS, 75 ILCS 5/4-7(12) of the Illinois Local Library Act provides that no non-resident fee shall apply to “a nonresident who, as an individual or as a partner, principal stockholder, or other joint owner, owns or leases property that is taxed for library service or is a senior administrative officer of a firm, business, or other corporation owning taxable property within the city, incorporated town, village or township upon the presentation of the most recent tax bill upon that taxable property or a copy of the commercial lease of that taxable property;” and

WHEREAS, in accord with the mandates of 75 ILCS 5/4-7(12), the Bellwood Public Library is committed to extending the use of the Library to such exempt non-residents who own or lease certain taxable property within the Village of Bellwood, Cook County, Illinois.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES OF THE BELLWOOD PUBLIC LIBRARY:

SECTION 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The above recitals are expressly incorporated in and made a part of this Ordinance as though fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2. No Participation in Non-Resident Library Card Program. For the ensuing 12 months, *to wit*, **from June 1, 2020 through May 31, 2021**, the Bellwood Public Library shall not participate in the non-resident library card program given that no unserved areas are adjacent to the Library taxing area.

SECTION 3. Non-Resident Owning or Leasing Certain Property. A non-resident who, as an individual or as a partner, principal stockholder, or other joint owner, owns or leases property that is taxed for library service or is a senior administrative officer of a firm, business, or other corporation owning taxable property within the Village of Bellwood, Cook County, Illinois, upon the presentation of the most recent tax bill upon that taxable property or a copy of the commercial lease of that taxable property, will be issued a non-resident library card valid for one (1) year from the date of its issuance which shall accord the non-resident cardholder all of the services, privileges and use that the Library provides to its residents including reciprocal borrowing privileges.

SECTION 4. Notice to Library Regional System. The Library Director, or her designee, shall notify the regional library system within thirty (30) days after the adoption of this Ordinance of the action taken herein.

SECTION 5. Public Inspection of Library's Policy. The Board of Trustees' policy for service to non-residents shall be available for public inspection at the Library.

SECTION 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
